- Strategic direction creates the conditions for better collaborative working at both the national and local level

Defining community safety:

Why: - provides greater clarity for community safety practitioners and partners and creates the conditions for collaborative working

Principles underpinning a definition:

- Being person centred and place- based
- Addressing the needs of communities holistically

Definition:

"A safe community is a liveable community, where people can go about their daily activities in an environment without fear, risk, harm or injury. Community safety is about building strong, cohesive, vibrant, participatory communities, where homes, the roads, public spaces and the workplace are safe and feel safe for everyone to enjoy"

 Community safety has a key role to play in creating conditions in which communities want and feel able to participate in local decision making

(Local community planning, Neighbourhood Development Plans, Democracy Matters, Local Governance Review, Community Empowerment)
