One in five crimes involved domestic abuse during Covid lockdown

The first national lockdown saw a spike in <u>domestic abuse</u> cases in England and Wales, new figures have shown, with one in five offences recorded by police related to domestic violence.

Lack of social housing harming domestic abuse survivors, says homelessness charity

The lack of social housing is preventing people from leaving abusive partners, Shelter Scotland has warned.

Between April 2019 and March 2020, 4,832 homelessness applications were made to local authorities where domestic abuse was given as a reason for leaving their old address. Elder Abuse

One in five older people in the UK have been abused, poll finds

Abuse of older people is at "unprecedented levels" according to a leading charity.

Hourglass, formerly Action on Elder Abuse, said polling that it had commissioned suggested as many as one in five people in the UK over the age of 65 have been abused. The charity calculates that this equates to 2.7 million victims across the UK. Previous estimates have put the figure significantly lower. The World Health Organization estimates that – globally – one in six people aged 60 and older experienced some form of abuse in the last year.

A82 public consultation aims to reduce accidents

IT is one of the most scenic roads in Scotland but is also one of the most dangerous due to the layout and high volumes of traffic, especially at the height of the summer tourist season.

'Shocking' rise in drivers caught speeding during lockdown

New government data shows a "shocking" rise in the proportion of people speeding during the first lockdown.

In the second quarter of 2020, 53 percent of cars exceeded the speed limit on <u>motorways</u>, compared with 52 percent in the equivalent period of 2019. On National Speed Limit (NSL) single carriageways, 17 percent exceeded the limit in Q2, compared with 10 percent in Q2 2019. On 30mph roads, the figures were 63 percent and 56 percent respectively. - https://www.motoringresearch.com/car-news/shocking-rise-drivers-speeding-lockdown/
