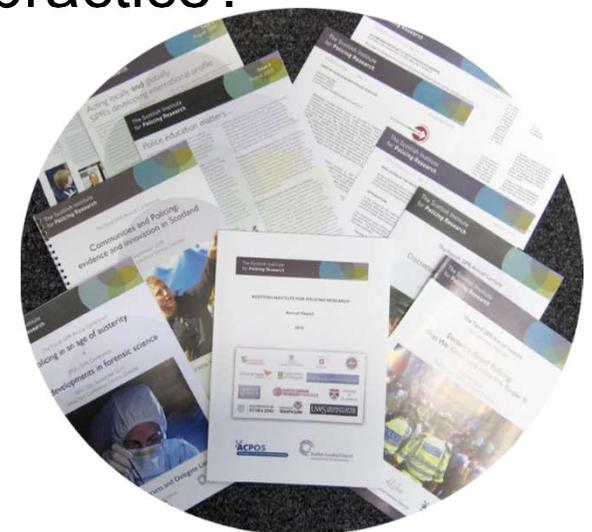

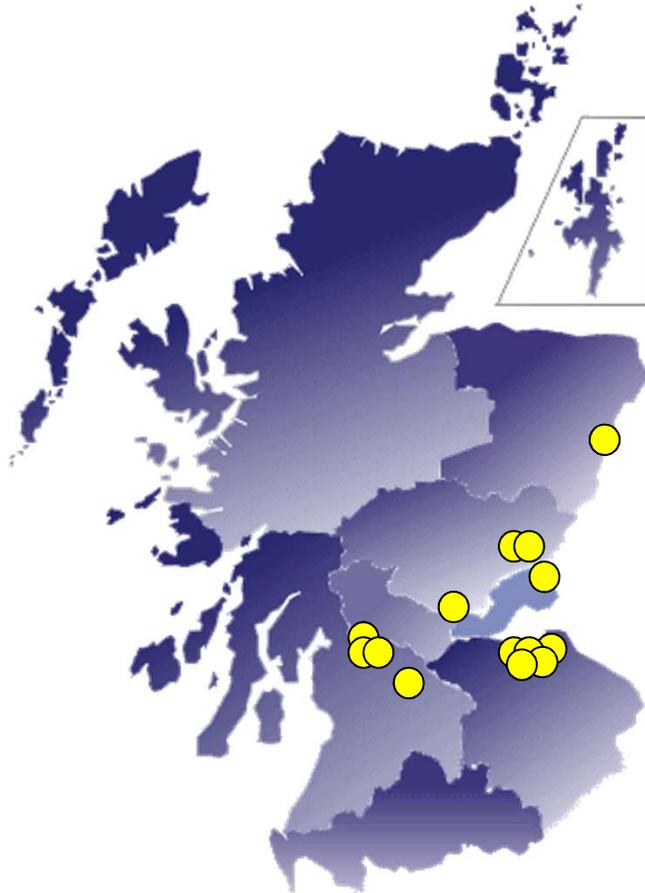

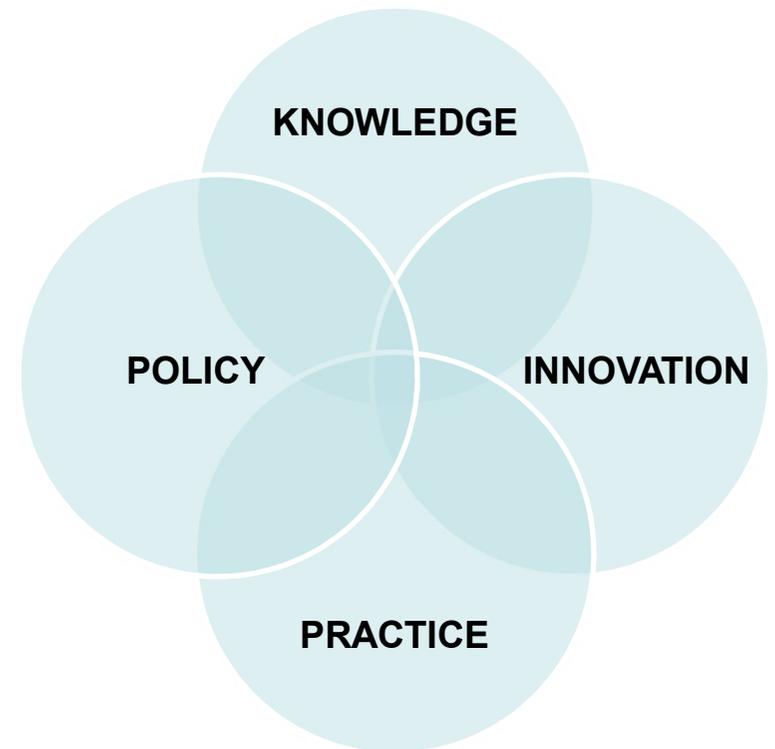

Aims to:

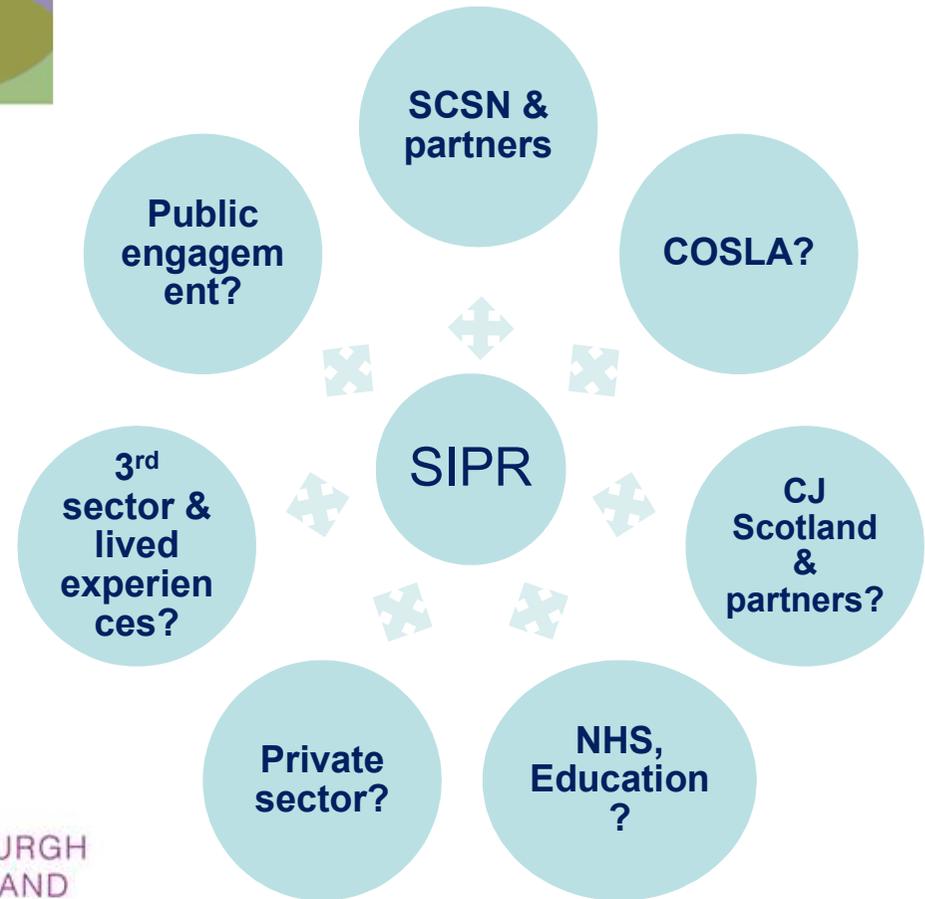
- Facilitate excellent, independent research of relevance to policing;

- Law Enforcement and Public Health Conference, October 2019 – wellbeing & safety





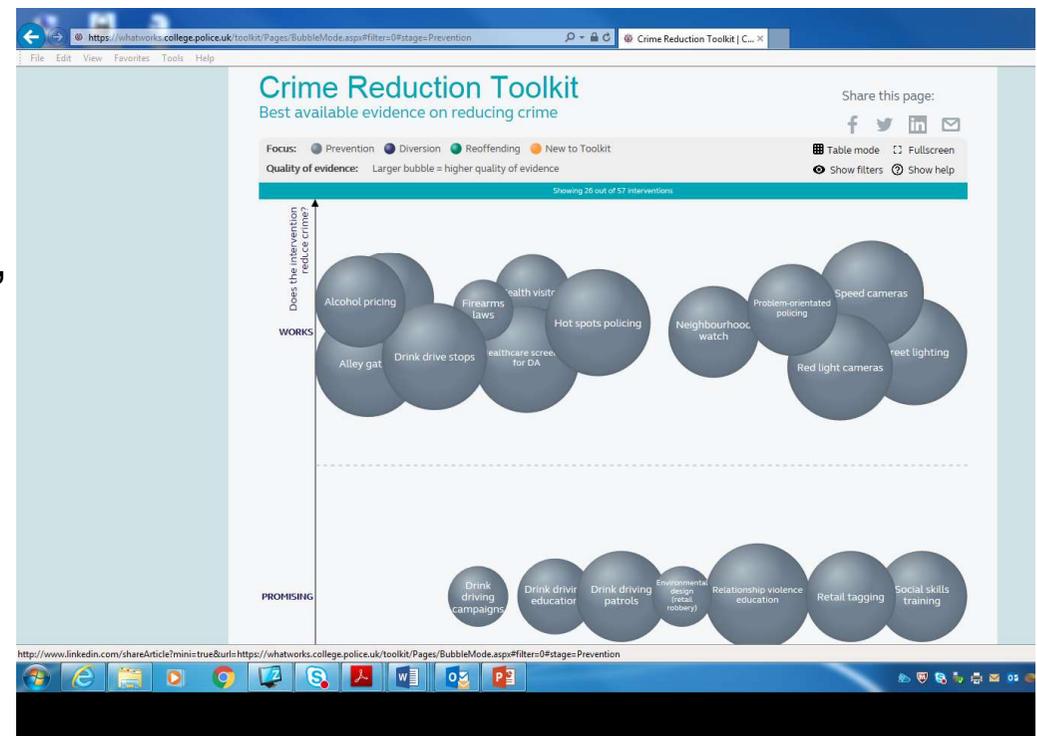
Research examples

How can research help to make the case for community safety?

- Legislation: P&FRS (Scotland) Act 2012 ‘to improve the safety and well-being of persons, localities and communities in Scotland’ – working in collaboration. Accessible to & engaged w local communities. Measures to prevent crime, harm and disorder.
- Engagement (& enforcement); *safety* not just crime reduction; prevention requires a partnership approach:
 - Crime Reduction Toolkit examples: neighbourhood watch, health visitors, alcohol pricing, drink drive stops, alley gating /street lighting, CCTV, speed cameras, problem-oriented & hot-spots policing





What works in linking research, policy & practice?

- Dissemination – communicating findings in ‘user-friendly’ ways.
- Social influence – using influential others to persuade and champion use of research.
- Facilitation – actively helping to use research, create conditions to support its use.
- Incentives and reinforcement
- Interactive approaches that strengthen links between research, policy & practice communities as most effective way to improve the use of research by public services (Nutley, Walter, Davies 2007)
 - ✓ encourages a two way flow of information
 - ✓ practitioners gain better knowledge of the latest research & helps academics to understand their needs



Opportunities /benefits SI PR offers researchers and practitioners:

- **Infra-structure** for engagement;
- **Investment** in research and knowledge exchange;
- **Innovation** in connecting evidence and practice
- **Interdisciplinary** community of researchers
- **International** networks of researchers and practitioners;
- **(Pathways to) Impact ...**
